

the fact that a label states or implies a foreign origin amounts to a claim for quality in the goods. Salad Oil is such a case, but Wines, Brandies, Gins, Liqueurs, etc., offer opportunities for similar deception.

The results of the present inspection may be summarized as below:—

Adulterated under the Act.....	11 "
Doubtful.....	1 "
Lost by breakage.....	1 "
