SCARBORO COUNCIL TAKES UP SUBURBAN SERVICE

Endorse Plan to Get Late and Early Transportation—County Happenings.

WOBBURN, Sept. 12.—(Special).—Delighted with the success which has attended the inauguration of a direct C. P.R. northern service from the city, the suburban districts to the north and east are becoming aroused to the necessity for better local conditions, and Scarborough council yesterday took a forward step by the unanimous adoption of a resolution nominating Reeve Amis, the county's first representative, to meet Sir Thomas Shaughnessy, president of the C. P.R., on his next visit to the city, with respect to a local service.

The council were a unit in the matter, and it is said the greatest enthusiasm centres, especially among Agincourt and Eglinton, over the proposal to secure from Sir Thomas, if possible, the stopping of the Ottawa or Montreal train (preferably the former), leaving North Toronto at 10 p.m., and similarly the early morning Ottawa train, reaching the Union Station at 7:35 a.m.

At Brown's Corners also a movement is under way to send a big delegation down to the city, looking to a better local service, as well as at Claremont, Locust Hill, and near the city at Leaside. Reeve Amis and the other representatives will accompany the delegation whenever the meeting is arranged. It is said that an enormous freight and passenger traffic would soon follow the inauguration of the service indicated.

The reeve and council, accompanied by Engineer Young, paid an official visit to the Kirkham bridge, a short distance to the east, and expressed pleasure generally with the character of the work. The new structure is a 70-foot span built of concrete and is a splendid modern asset. The cost will be in the neighborhood of \$60,000, and of this the county council probably contribute \$10,000, or possibly more. The contractors were Rutherford & Patten and on motion of Councilors Law and Ormerod, and a vote of thanks was ordered paid the firm. The road will now be opened for regular traffic.

Mr. Kirtson and Mr. Carnahan urged that some report be made to the roadway at the Highland Creek bridge. Charles Hughes, who acted as inspector on the Kirkham bridge, gets \$34.70. F. E. WALKED THE STREETS
Ten Thousand Unable to Find Lodgings at Montreal.

MONTREAL, Sept. 12.—Ten thousand people walked the streets of Montreal last night unable to find lodgings. The food ran short in the restaurants, and crowds flocked to the fruit stores, and made meals from bananas and candy.

All night long the Grand Trunk station was packed to suffocation, policemen refusing to let any more in, and this caused scores to lose their trains. The Canadian Pacific ran seven trains to Quebec yesterday evening, and other lines were, likewise, choked with specials.

The only fatality in connection with the Eucharistic demonstration so far reported is the death of Abbe Verrett, cure of St. Sylvester, Que., who was crushed by a team while getting off a car on St. Lawrence-street, Saturday, and died yesterday morning at the Hotel Dieu.
