finally laid over until next year.

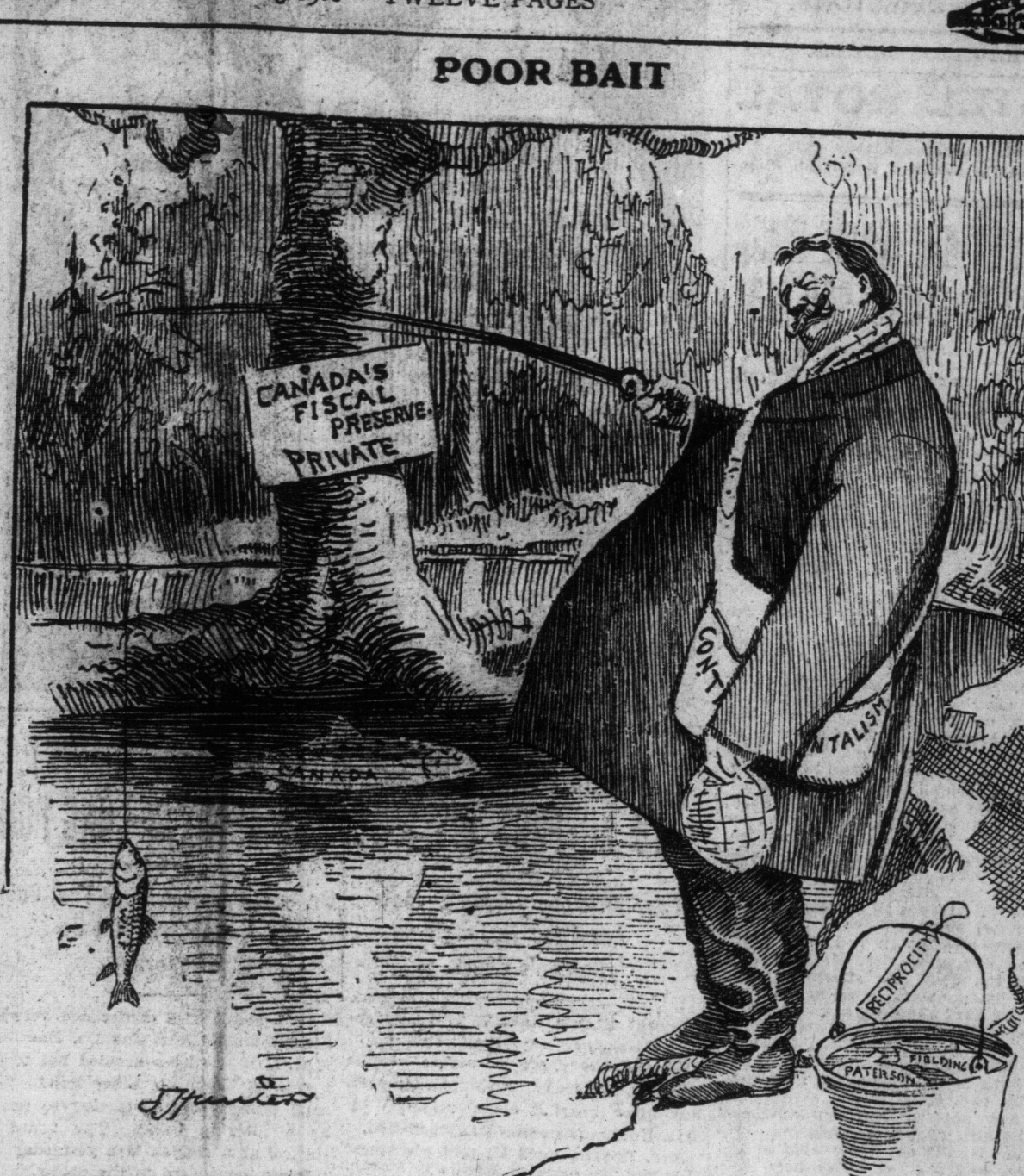
