

HEAT PROOF DAMAGE REPORTS

Argentine Rains and Estimate of Low Yield in Canada Cause Brisk Buying.

CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—After a listless forenoon the grain market today became suddenly active and firm today, all closing higher—wheat 7-8 to 11-30, corn 3-8 to 1-30 and oats 1-30 to 1-30. Provisions rose 1-8 to 17-1-30. Heavy general rains, extending over the entire wheat belt of the Argentine, where harvesting is in progress, sent the first bullish news of the day. The trade ignored it for a time, but when a private authority was rumored—and the rumor lacked confirmation or denial—to have estimated the Canadian crop at 50,000,000 bushels less than the government, wheat suddenly became well worth having. Speculators who have been negatively bullish suddenly became active and shorts got from under. All this occurred despite the sluggishness of the market and a heavy movement to primary points, today's receipts being almost twice the quantity of the corresponding day a year ago.

The date the movement aggregated 25,000 bushels more than for the entire crop year of 1911 and 1,000,000 bushels greater than 1910. Strength in Corn. A poor cash market and excellent weather for shelling, conditioning and shipping, influenced the corn market early, but strength developed with the later advance in wheat and closing prices were close to the top. Cash grades were steady. Oats closed at the top, shorts covering under the influence of other grains. There was nothing in the spot situation to excite buying. Speculative buying of provisions, due largely to the continued light run of hogs, higher prices at the yards and the strength in grain.

MONTREAL, Dec. 20.—A feature of the export grain trade today was the good demand from New York for Manitoba wheat and a fair amount of business done.
