CHICAGO, Dec. 20.—After a listless forenoon the grain markets here became suddenly active and firm today, all closing higher—wheat 7-8c to 11-8c, corn 3-8c to 1-2c and oats 1-8c to 3-8c up. Provisions rose 7 1-2c to 17 1-2c. Heavy general rains, extending over the entire wheat belt of the Argentine, where harvesting is in progress, was the first bullish news of the day. The trade ignored it for a time, but when a private authority was rumored The trade ignored it for a time, but when a private authority was rumored—and the rumor lacked confirmation or denial—to have estimated the Canadian crop at 50,000,000 bushels less than the government, wheat suddenly became well worth having. Speculators who have been negatively bullish suddenly became active and shorts got from under. All this occurred despite the sluggish cash market and a heavy movement to primary points, today's receipts being almost treble the quantity of the corresponding day a year ago.

To date the movement aggregated 28,000 hushels more than for the entire crop year of 1911 and 1,000,000 bushels greater than 1900.
