Barley prices are reminders of the palmy days when the Yankees carried off our crops for 80 cents per bushel before the McKinley tariff gave the barley farmer a black eve. But it was a good thing for Ontario as it turned the barley back into the farms thru live stock, so that to-day we raise more barley than in those days of big prices. Yet 70 cents is being paid at country points for barley and many good yields of grain are reported. Instead of feeding this barley this year much of it is going to be, sold off. One farmer near Dunbarton has 2,500-70ushels which is selling at 70c. Others are holding off for higher prices.


