Agnes Holland's Pauper Burial.

Editor World: In perusing the issue of your valuable paper of yesterday, I noticed a paragraph under the heading, "She Was a Pauper." It will certainly be an awful and everlasting rebuke to the societies in this city who are ever ready to have their names mentioned as doing charitable acts. Now, sir, according to newspaper reports, the events leading to the sad death of Agnes Holland are such that would arouse sympathy, as well as pity, in the hearts of every true and loyal Canadian. A short synopsis of her history in this country tends to heap burning coals upon the heads of those who had it in their power to administer that which is expected from the hands of those who profess Christian charity. The Y.W.C.A. is a society which has for its watchwords "Charity and Christianity."

Now, this unfortunate young girl leaves the home of her parents in England; she comes to Canada, no doubt to seek a livelihood. We next hear of her as nurse in the General Hospital, Montreal, and here it might be said that Miss Holland, in undertaking the duties of nurse, not only showed a courageous spirit, but a "charitable and Christian spirit," much above the common—one who would fain minister to those afflicted with disease, perhaps say a prayer over the poor, unfortunate whose life was ebbing fast away. After her energetic, charitable career, we next find her engaged in the office of The Montreal Star, showing that in her younger days she must have had good schooling. She came to Toronto, but after several attempts to fill the role of servant, she was obliged to seek assistance in the Women's Sherter, where it is understood she remained until quite recently, when she was given a position as nurse to a lady, who speaks in the highest terms of her ed until quite recently, when she was given a position as nurse to a lady, who speaks in the highest terms of her in that caned to

Now, Mr. Editor, I am of the opinion that the unfortunate girl might have been living to-day had those in authority used better judgment, and extended a little more charitable sympathy at the proper time. When her trunk had been left as security for moneys owed the institution by her for board, I would judge that the gold watch referred to as part of her effects would have been sufficient, and by letting the girl have her trunk would have perhaps saved her from a sudden death, brought about by nervous excitement produced by the retention of her effects.

Now, in conclusion, I will say that the Christian societies of Toronto, more especially the one above referred to, have fallen in the estimation of many who are aroused to active interest in this case, and who are loud in their condemnation of the treatment accorded to the unfortunate girl. The very fact of the burial of a Christian taking place without a minister officiating is something beyond comprehension, and tends to place a blot on the history of those "Christians" in touch with the case that will require many charitable deeds to be done before it will be effaced.




