## WILL APPEAL TO ENGLAND

Filipinos Propose to Take That Course  
in Reference to United  
States Aggression.

IF THEY GET NO RELIEF THERE

They Will Carry Their Grievances  
to the Nations of Europe,  
According to Agoncillo Says.

Manila, Feb. 15.—(Special.)—England  
will be appealed to against American  
aggression in the Philippines, says the latter's  
representative in this city. "If England  
will not listen to the cry of the Filipinos,  
they will lay their case before the nations  
of Europe," said Agoncillo.  
Senor Luna, after his consultations and  
deliberations with Agoncillo and Marti, will  
go to Europe, traveling by way of St. John,  
N.B., and Liverpool, to lay the case of the  
islanders before the statesmen and diplo-  
mats of the Old World.  
General Diego de Dios and Mr. M. Rivera,  
merchants both influential in Manila, who  
were in San Francisco the other day, are  
expected to arrive here in about a week,  
and they, too, will consult with Agoncillo  
as to what future steps ought to be taken  
to save the country.  
Senor Agoncillo and Marti strongly re-  
commended the designation of rebels as free-  
fighters to the Filipino patriots, who are  
fighting for the liberation of the islands  
from foreign domination. America's mist  
for conquest and greed for territorial ag-  
grandisement have, they declare, tempted  
her to plunge into a wicked and unjust war  
against a people and nation in which she has  
no concern of right.
