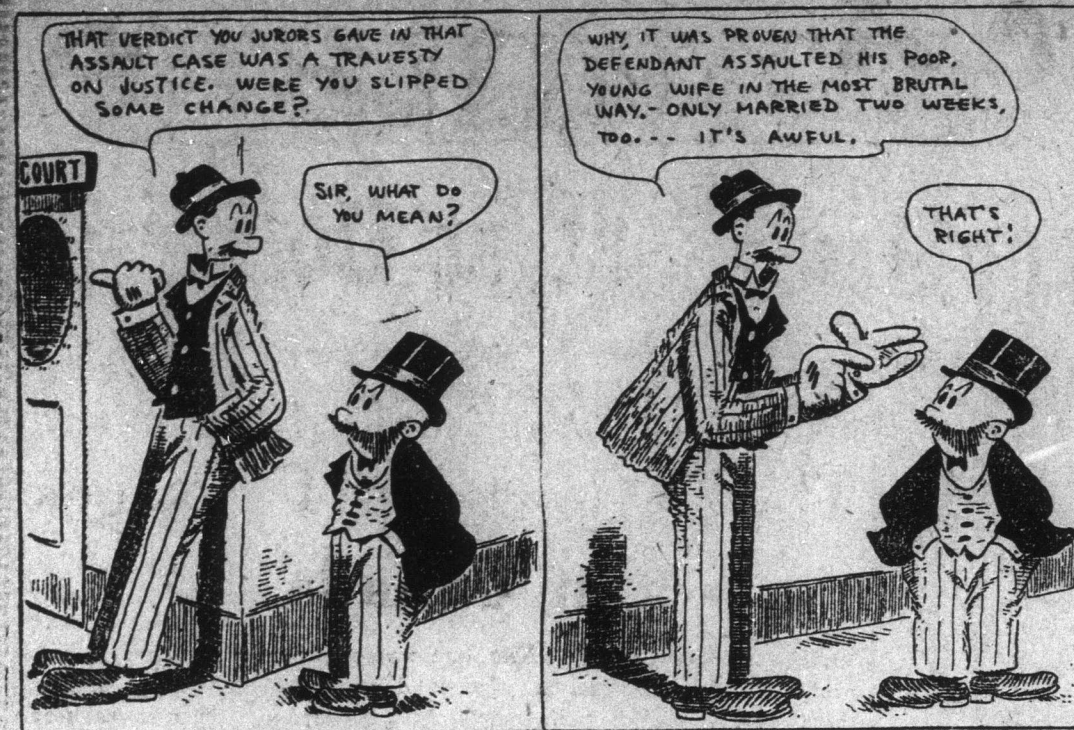

IN TENNIS AND GOLF.

More than one tennis expert has written us, offering fair proof that neither Miss Browne nor Miss Bjurstedt would rank among the first eight tennis players in America.

This statement can be established without much debate. There are just about five hundred golfers in the country rated as 5 handicap men, or lower.

There are at least five hundred golfers who can play below 80 or around 80 with consistent effort.

Yet neither Miss Stirling nor Mrs. Gavin can very often get below 83 or 84 over an average hard course.

Neither would be able to get a handicap approaching 5 in the U. S. G. A. These figures outline the situation without the need of debate. They come very close to telling the entire story.
