BOUND TO HELP CANADIAN BONDS

Optimistic View Taken by Financial Men Here Re Drayton's Order.

Optimism was generally expressed by financial men who were interviewed by The Advertiser today in response to the action of Sir Henry Drayton in prohibiting the buying with cash and the importation of all foreign bonds and securities into Canada. It is their opinion that the move will protect the Canadian Victory bond market and will help materially to stabilize the exchange rates.

According to F. B. Clarke, there will be no great financial losses experienced by the public, although considerable confusion is bound to come. The bond brokers and other brokerage firms will lose considerable money through loss of business, and other firms of the country who speculate in stocks and bonds will be prevented from making big profits through the fluctuations of the market. He said that financial men were experiencing a shaken harvest at the present time and would have continued to do so in the near future if the order had not been passed.

The move had no doubt been taken to stabilize the rate of exchange and to protect the value of the Canadian war bonds. There were great fears that the heavy importation of British war bonds, before the war, would have a detrimental effect on the Canadian market.

To assuage him in the coming of the future, Gordon Phillips, secretary of the Chamber of Commerce, has requested many of the larger firms of the city to send in letters telling how they would be benefited.

Go to Canada. Since the war the value of the value of sterling has resulted in the purchase of many of these bonds to Canada, where they found ready sale, because they offered usually a 6 per cent dividend. To take advantage of the change to get greater returns for their money, many Canadians had been buying these war bonds and investing them in Canadian bonds and securities.

By prohibiting the importation of foreign securities and bonds, the trade balance will be helped considerably, as they are not being sold in Canada, and the value of the Canadian dollar will be maintained.

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TO CONSIDER LIBRARY AND FIRE ESTIMATES

No. 1 Committee Will Have a Busy Evening.

An increase of almost 100 per cent is shown in the estimates of the fire department, which will be considered by No. 1 committee of the city council at a special meeting tonight.

This will provide for a new truck to cost \$12,000. He may also add the committee to consider a new alarm system for the business district of the city.

The total amount he estimates necessary for the department for 1920 is \$156,531, divided among the various stations as follows: No. 1 (central) \$47,738; No. 2, \$17,233; No. 3, \$13,580; No. 4, \$13,688; No. 5, \$14,133.

Aside from capital expenditures, salaries form the largest item, a total of \$66,972 being required for this purpose. These figures are based on an increase in pay which the men are asking, and which may have to be considered. There is also a possibility that the charges for materials will be substantially increased, as the public utilities commission is considering such action.

A Public Library. Five thousand dollars is required for new books in the public library, which estimates that it will need \$21,344 for the year. It has a balance of \$12,150 from last year. Government grants of \$720, and petty cash receipts amounting to \$1,150 so that the actual amount required from the city this year is only \$19,050.

Salaries require \$13,725 while other help adds \$554 to the whole. Municipal colors are required for \$2,000 and \$850 for binding. Building and furniture will cost \$700 and light, heat and water, \$1,800.
