## SECOND MAN IS DEAD MARTYRS TO SCIENCE

Victims of Explosion Were Using a New Compound-Writ Issued in Power Matter.

HAMILTON, July 20.—(Special.)— The issue of an injunction to restrain the city from entering into a contract with the Cataract Power Co., by the bylaws passed on Friday night, has caused the aldermen who were so zealous for the company's interests to feel that they are not yet out of the woods. The bylaw has not been signed by Mayor Stewart yet, as it has not been engrossed, but in view of the action that has been begun it will make little difference whether or not he signs it in the meanwhile. Second Man Dead.

They were using a strong explosive invented by Green and known as "Grenite." None of the wintesses called at the enquiry to-night could throw any light on the mishap. Surrick and Green were the only two near the scene of the accident and antimorthem stotements were not secured from them. Foreman Niblock testified that the men were using "Greenite." The jury brought in a verdict that Surrick came to his death while in the discharge of his duty, and that they could not attach blame to anyone.
