When the sixth opened, Lewis went at his man like a tiger, and, forcing Burke to the ropes, sent a left to the face and crossed his right to the jaw heavily. Delegate Powell of Ottawa, in a well re-ceived speech, outlined the law of On-tario, which compells a union to inatus or enter into the protected prem-ises without starting the alarm.
