THREE CITY SOLDIERS IN WOUNDED LIST

That her step-son, Pte. Horace M. Ayer, had been wounded in action on May 21, was the message received by Mrs. E. J. Ayer of 141 Wright street.

His brother, Walter S. Ayer, was in the same company, but sustained a gunshot wound in the right leg on April 28 and is now convalescing in St. Luke's Hospital in Boulogne.

Mr. E. J. Ayer, 288 Duke street, was advised this morning from Ottawa that her son, Allan, a member of a local Railway Construction Battalion, had been dangerously wounded, and had been admitted to No. 10 Casualty Clearing Station on May 28.
