THE KINDRED OF BONAR LAW

The father of the late Bonar Law was the Rev. James Law, who was born at Maddybenney, near Coleraine, Ireland. He died at Maddybenney in October, 1882, at the age of 63. He was educated for the Presbyterian ministry at Glasgow, and the only pastor he ever held was at Kingston, New Brunswick (name of village was changed to Reston, N. B.) He lived in New Brunswick about half of his lifetime, 1846 to 1878, and because of ill-health, returned to Ireland, four years before his death. His first wife was Eliza Kidston of Glasgow; his second, Sophia Wood of Richibucto.
