Toronto, Sept. 28—Dr. C. K. Clarke, tenist, yesterday sounded a nate of the second secon

Toronto, Sept. 28—Dr. C. K. Clarke, alienist, yesterday sounded a note of warning in connection with the immigration from the British Isles and Europe, which will be heavy within the next few months. His warning was occasioned by a report that 4,000 children would soon be brought to homes in Canada from central Europe.

"Every child under sixteen years should pass the most rigid examination before it is admitted into Canada," he said. "These children from central Europe may suffer from trachoma, typhus and tuberculosis, or any of the many diseases which were prevalent during the war and afterwards."
