DEATH OF JOHN E. OF THE PRIZE RING

IRVINE IN MONTREAL Held High Place in the Life of St. John-Rev. Dr. Campbell Pays

city and province when the news of the death of John E. Irvine becomes known. He passed away Saturday afternoon in Montreal, in the home of his son, A. M. Irvine. He was a native of this city, and went west a few years ago. He was ever found prominently identified with all movements which had for their object the relief of suffering of any kind.

Rev. Dr. George M. Campbell when seen at his home last night said: "The despatches tomorrow morning will tell of the death in Montreal, on Saturday afternoon, of John E.-Irvine, one of the oldest and most highly esteemed residents of this city. He was born in this city sixty-five years ago, his father being a prominent ship-builder with a yard near the Marsh bridge. His father died when he was three years old, and the family removed to Marshalltown (N. S.) In 1861 he returned to this city and entered the offices of Messrs. Troop & Sons, then the largest shipping firm in eastern Canada. In 1881 he was taken into partnership and remained a member of the firm till he removed to Calgary in 1905. His object in going west was to locate with his son, W. Henry Irvine.
