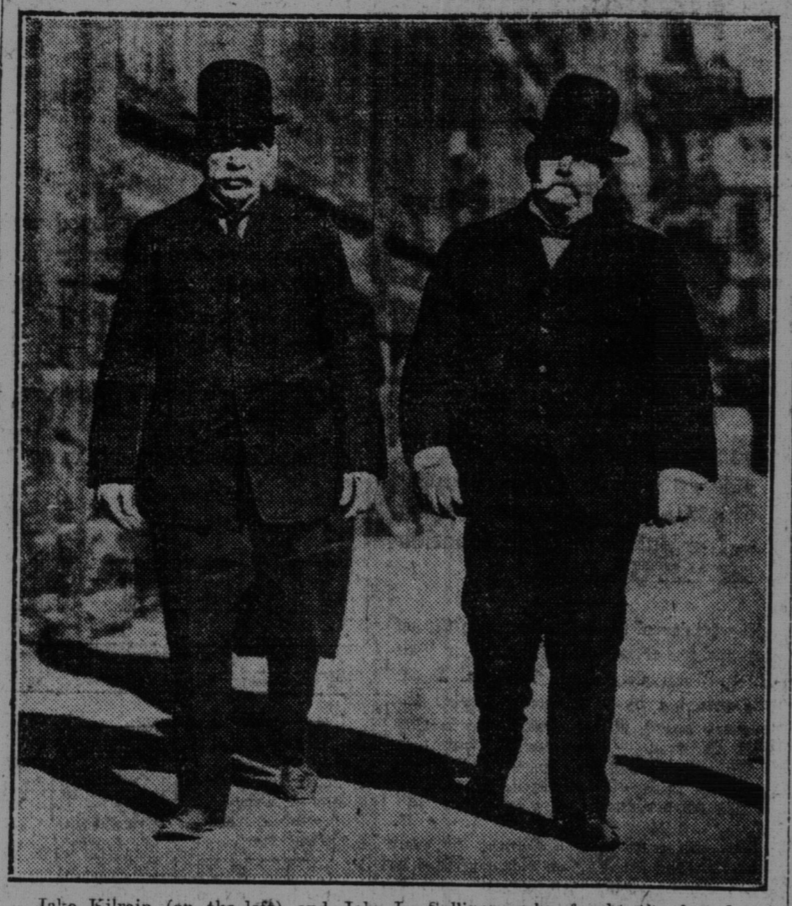


TWO OLD GLADIATORS OF THE PRIZE RING

DEATH OF JOHN E. IRVINE IN MONTREAL

Held High Place in the Life of St. John—Rev. Dr. Campbell Pays Him Tribute

Deep regret will be felt all over this city and province when the news of the death of John E. Irvine becomes known. He passed away Saturday afternoon in Montreal, in the home of his son, A. M. Irvine. He was a native of this city, and spent a few years ago. He was ever found prominently identified with all movements which had for their object the relief of suffering of any kind.

Rev. Dr. George M. Campbell when seen at his home last night said: "The departure tomorrow morning will tell of the death of one of our most distinguished citizens. John E. Irvine, one of the oldest and most highly esteemed residents of this city. He was born in this city sixty-five years ago, his father being a prominent shipper in the city of Montreal. In 1841 he was taken into partnership and remained a member of the firm till he removed to Calgary in 1883. His object in going west was to locate with his son, Henry Irvine.

A brain and heart and personality such as those possessed by Mr. Irvine are a heritage from the Lord. He was endowed with intellectual gifts and keenness as well as clear business acumen. He possessed in a remarkable degree the ability to see the practical side of things. His splendid gifts and practical common sense fitted him for conspicuous positions in movements looking to the advancement of the welfare of the people. As such he was his native city along moral or commercial lines.

Every institution in the city that had for its object the amelioration of suffering had his loyal and practical support. During his last years he served as the M. C. A., altogether devoting ten years of his life to the duties of that office. He was one of the first to take into consideration the securing of new quarters for the local Y. M. C. A., and gave up the office of the Y. M. C. A. to the task till his removal to the west.

He was one of the presidents of the N. B. Bible Society. He was on the official boards of four of the Methodist churches in this city, and a trustee as well. He was a member of the Y. M. C. A., the Boys' Industrial Home, the Protestant Orphans' Home and the Home for the Blind. He was also a member of the international committee of the organization.
