

# GRAND FALLS COMPANY PUTS \$1,500,000 VALUE ON HOLDING

FREDERICTON, April 23—In a special interview with The Times-Star representative here today, Premier Veniot made some important observations regarding the rights and privileges of the International Paper Company in so far as these relate to the proposed hydro-electric development at Grand Falls.

The Premier, in his statement, made a brief reference to the history of the Grand Falls project and the securing of development rights there twenty years ago by the Grand Falls Co. Incidentally, Hon. Mr. Veniot made a significant declaration that the duty of the Government is to secure a release of these rights and privileges held by the International Paper Co. under the most favorable terms and at a price as much below the maximum consideration of \$1,500,000 as can possibly be obtained.

## ELABORATE REPORT

During his address to the members of the House, at the informal sitting Wednesday morning, H. G. Acres, consulting engineer of the New Brunswick Power Commission, made some extended reference to the International Paper Company's position with regard to the development scheme. This statement of Mr. Acres aroused considerable interest about the House and in the country and now Premier Veniot has elaborated on the Acres report in this regard.

## TEXT OF STATEMENT

The complete statement of the Premier follows:

"Some twenty years ago the predecessors of the Grand Falls Co. secured the development rights at Grand Falls from the Provincial Government. Although nothing of a tangible nature resulted from the granting of these rights and their subsequent renewal, it is now stated that their actual cash investment in the scheme, with accrued charges to date, amounts to \$1,500,000. 'Whether or not the Grand Falls Co. has been wholly responsible for its failure to exercise the franchise so obtained is open to question, but the fact remains that throughout this province there exists at the present time a sentiment that in failing to develop Grand Falls the company was guilty of a breach of faith.

## ECONOMIES NOT REALIZED

"It is of interest to surmise what the present condition would have been if the company had actually proceeded

in good faith and developed Grand Falls twenty years ago.

"At that time the broader economic aspects of hydro-electric development had not been realized. A newspaper mill of 100 tons daily capacity was a pretentious financial venture. Turbines of more than 5,000 horse power capacity were practically unknown outside of such world famous developments as those at Niagara. Such being the case, the Grand Falls Co. would not, under any circumstances, have considered the development of Grand Falls on any larger scale than that necessary for the operation of a newspaper mill of 150 to 200 tons daily capacity.

## INADEQUATE, HE SAYS

"Such a development, even though it had been constructed in accordance with the very best engineering standards of that day, would be utterly inadequate and useless, as measured by present day standards and by the wider field of beneficial use of hydro power.

"On the other hand, such a development, obsolete though it might be, would even yet have been supporting a living and profitable industry, by reason of unusually favorable conditions as regards wood supply and the resulting from the vastly lower low flow fixed charges which would have resulted from the twenty years construction costs which obtained twenty years ago.

## A DIFFERENT SITUATION

"It follows, therefore, that instead of reclaiming a water power in its natural state, the province would, under the above conditions, have been faced with the necessity of taking over an active industry through a tedious and protracted process of negotiations, involving contentions and thankless disputes over goodwill and the like.

"It is hardly necessary to observe that the sum of \$1,500,000, which now seems to constitute the total investment

ment of the company in the Grand Falls project, constitutes only a fraction of what the province would have had to pay under the above condition. It is also probably a fact that subsequent to such purchase the entire existing installation would have required to be demolished on a strictly scrap basis before the installation of a modern plant along the lines of present engineering standards and of the province's present need could be undertaken.

## UNWILLING GUARDIAN

"It is even fair to state that if the province were now confronted with such a problem in connection with the reclamation of Grand Falls, the total obligations would prove to be beyond the bounds of economic feasibility.

"Finally, the interesting conclusion is

reached that in 'breaking faith' in respect of its franchise obligations, the Grand Falls Company has unwittingly exercised a stewardship which has kept the power site at Grand Falls in its natural state against the day of the province's extreme need. It is not the fault of the present administration that this stewardship was delegated, nor is it fair to argue that those who were responsible should have foreseen the needs of the present day and held Grand Falls against such eventualities.

## GOVERNMENT'S DUTY

"The fact to be faced is that this stewardship was actually delegated to the Grand Falls Company and has been exercised for twenty years. The maximum consideration for services rendered in the premises is \$1,500,000.

The duty of the present Government is to secure a release under the most favorable terms possible, and at a price as much below the maximum as can possibly be obtained."
