The increase in the inspection of Raw Hides, since 6th September, 1866, is due to the Law rendering the inspection compulsory, having gone into operation on that day.

Remarks.—Out of the 29,300 Sides Sole Leather inspected, 12,000 were inspected at the Champlain Tanneries, and 3,000 at the Roxton Falls Tanneries. Those 15,000 were forwarded to Montreal, to be sold there. There are only two houses in Quebec who manufacture sole leather, Messrs. O. L. Richardson & Son and Mr. Jos. Louis. Out of the 10,000 Sides Uppers measured, two-thirds were shipped to Montreal, but these did not go through a full inspection, the measurement only having been obtained, and not the quality of the leather, manufactures objecting to further inspection, as it is not compulsory on those leathers.

The law enforcing the inspection of Raw Hides works pretty well, and gives confidence to purchasers, and manufacturers buy with more satisfaction. It has also had the effect of stopping the damage to hides by knife cutting.

I would also remark that the Quebec market doos not supply more than one-third to the Quebec manufacturers, the remainder being purchased in the Montreal, Upper Canada and Chicago markets.
