THE Committee of the FEMALE BENEVOLENT SOCIETY feel great pleasure in presenting the following statement of their labours during the past year—a statement which will furnish the gratifying evidence that the Charitable Institution committed to their management continues to share the generous patronage of its friends, and to exercise a truly beneficial influence upon the condition of the afflicted, the stranger, the orphan, and the widow.

By unwearied and persevering exertions the Collectors have succeeded in obtaining Subscriptions, in money and clothing, to the amount of £65, 0s. 9d. currency,—being an increase, upon the Subscriptions of last year, of £4, 8s. 7d.

They have expended, for articles of clothing, £64, 2s. 3d.; and have in hand a small balance of 18s. 6d.

Upwards of five hundred garments have been distributed among poor families, who have thus been supplied with articles of clothing,
