These sailings have been com-piled from information furnished by the Agents of the different lines, and show 106, as compared with 185 for the year previous. All schedules are not complete, however. The schedule is as follows: 1912-13 1913-1

Allan Line, C. P. R. Line, Cunard Line, Furness Line, White Star Dominion Line, Austria-American Line, Uranium Line, Royal Line.

While the port loses the Royal Line, only five of these steamers were here last year and were the only mail boats that remained here for a week, whereas, this winter the schedule shows eleven Empresses and ten Allan boats, or twenty one in all, each stopping here a week or thereabouts between mails. There are fifteen Cunarders scheduled for this port, five Norway-American boats, and one, with a possible three, Austris-American boats. (The schedule of these lines have only been furnished to December 31st.) All new to this port.

The list as given includes only the transstlantic sailings, besides which there are the Royal Mail West India service, the Jamaica service, the Warren Line, Red Cross Line, Plant Line and others, all of which use the terminal piers. According to the St. John "Standard" of Saturday last the sailings to that port, not including the "Royal's" Pickford & Black and the Royal Mail services, number 130.
