DEATH IN THE TELEPHONE.

According to a report by a medical officer from Westminster to The Lancet, a startling result has been attained from a test to discover whether tuberculosis germs exist in telephone mouth pieces.

One of the post office public telephonts on the central exchange was wiped around with a swab to remove any existing germs in the mouthpiece, and the contents of the swab used to inoculate two guinea pigs. One guinea pig was killed twenty-three days after inoculation, and a post-mortem exam-

plg was killed twenty-three days after inoculation, and a post-mortem examination showed pronounced signs of tuberculosis. The second guinea pig was killed twenty-seven days after inoculation and showed similar signs of infection, thus proving that the deadly germs of tuberculosis can be transmitted by the public telephone as at present in general use.

# **NEW YORK IN GRIP** OF WINTER WEATHER

Coldest August Weather for 23 Years

TWO DEATHS RESULT

More Than Three Inches of Rain Falls-Thermometer

at 56

NEW YORK, Aug. 27 .- A terrific downpour of rain, lasting for more than twenty-four hours and attended by the coldest August weather New York has experienced for twenty-three years, was responsible for two deaths today and great property damage. More than three inches of rain fell and the thermometer registered as low as the thermometer registered as low as fifty-six degrees. Not since Aug. 27, 28 and 29, 1885, has it been so cold during this month. A chill wind, which blew a gale during the night, tore up trees and levelled field crops in the vicinity of New York. Those to meet death were John Lynch, who was drawn into a broken sower hole in New York while at work with a repair gang, and an unidentified cripple, who sought shelter from the cold and rain in an East Side hallway. The cripple wrapped his body in papers, but the rain soaked through and a few hours later he was found dead.

Never in the history of the municipal lodging house have so many applicants for a night's shelter been received during the month of August.
