The Deaf and Dumb Institution investigation, which the province was called upon to shoulder, took out of the provincial revenue, \$4,367.30.

The item unforseen expenditures presents some interesting reading. It just cost New Brunswick \$5,247.09 for 1903 for expenses that neither the attorney general nor provincial secretary were able to see last session.

STILL PREPARING.

Japan Is Now Landing Troops in Korea.

The Work Is Easy Since the Russian Fleet Has Been Shattered.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 18.—St. Petersburg is flooded with rumors from all directions regarding the plans of the Japanese now that the Russian fleet at Port Arthur is unable to get out.

The Associated Press in a despatch from Port Arthur Sunday last gave twenty as the number of Japanese transports reported as having been sighted steaming in the direction of the port of Newchwang.
