

careful and prayerful consideration of our denominational bodies, whether the time has not fully arrived for the establishment of a denominational Book Depository, where, under proper and responsible supervision, books and papers may be obtained at reasonable rates, and the wants of the various departments of the body be met. The establishment of such a depository, in conjunction with the Baptist Tract Society, established in St. John, whose efforts to supply the denomination with Tracts should be encouraged, would materially assist in securing the admission to the libraries of our Sabbath Schools and to our families, of proper books, and thereby obviate many of the evils that at present exist; and further, by an efficient system of colportage inaugurate, and carry forward a good work for the Master.
