ORANGEMEN OBSERVE GUNPOWDER PLOT DAY

St. John District L. O. L. Held Dinner Last Night in Commemoration of Guy Fawkes Day.

"A better Empire would be the result if the principles of the Orange Order were carried out more extensively under the British flag," was the statement made by Recorder J. B. M. Baxter at the dinner given under the auspices of the St. John district L. O. L., at Wanamaker's restaurant, last night, to commemorate Guy Fawkes Day.

Mr. Baxter explained that the principles of equal rights for all men at all times and equal privileges to none, to give no offence to anybody and to be slow to take offence, liberty of thought and freedom of action exercised in all the colonies, was bound to make a more strongly united Empire.

He stated that observing Guy Fawkes Day each year, served to teach mankind to have better faith in the common people of the Empire in general.

In responding to the toast "The City of St. John," the speaker stated that it placed the different departments directly under the control of one man who worked hard in order to administer the affairs of his department well and thus make good. He referred to the excellent harbor made by the city government in obtaining a sugar refinery for St. John and declared that the improvements planned and being carried out in his department, that of stopping leaks in water mains would stop a sufficient quantity of water to supply the city.

More Money for Less Water. The quantity of water which united the agreement of March 14, 1910, the city was bound to supply to Mr. Durant for the water in any one day per meter, instead of \$2,500 per year, as formerly.

THE SUGAR REFINERY A GIFT FROM THE CITY COUNCIL

Continued from page 1. The Atlantic Sugar Refining Company was represented by D. Lorne McMillan, F. W. Anson, Mr. Mitchell, and F. R. Taylor, of this city, who acted for F. C. Durant, of the former negotiations.

The terms of the agreement had all been discussed by representatives of the city and company in private conference during the past few days, and little remained to be done at yesterday's meeting, except to formally ratify the decisions which had been reached.

To Avoid Litigation. It is agreed between the two parties that if at any time the city should claim a forfeiture under any of the provisions that the Public Utilities Commission shall hear and decide the claim and both parties bind themselves not to appeal from the judgment of that board in any case.

City May Inspect. The agreement also gives to the city by its agents or servants, the right to inspect the property of the company during the period of construction of the refinery and also the right to examine books, vouchers or records of the company or whatever else may be necessary to determine the agreement as to the operation of the refinery is being kept by the company.

Resolution of Approval. After the agreement had been read (Commissioner Schofield, seconded by Commissioner Agard, moved the following resolution: "That this council approves of the draft agreement with the Atlantic Sugar Refining Company, Limited, which was submitted by the mayor, and hereby directs that the same be executed by the mayor under the authority of the council."

CHANCE FOR THE SOCIAL WORKER HERE

John Bradford, at Meeting of Canadian Club, Describes Opportunities for Betterment of Conditions.

That the commercial spirit tended to prevent men seeing things in the light of the social conditions, and was creating social tendencies dangerous to the well-being of the people, and that there was need of a revival of the medieval conception of personal obligation to the community and the utilization of church and school buildings for the fulfilment of social functions, he was forced upon the communal organizations by the conditions surrounding the some life of the majority of the people, was the theme of an interesting lecture delivered before a small meeting of the Canadian Club last evening by John Bradford, the well known social worker of the enterprising town of Amherst.

School Curriculum. Our school curriculum, he said, was mainly designed in the interests of young people who contemplated entering the learned professions, though 90 or 95 per cent. of the young people attending the public schools had to enter industrial occupations.

Improvement Clubs. The speaker advocated the formation of clubs to study political, social, industrial and moral conditions in the city, saying that a federation of such clubs would be a factor for civic righteousness and progress that would prevail against all the forces of evil.
