The New Zealand and Australian

The Southern sailed from Shields March 28 and arrived at Sydney April 30. Since then she has been detained owing to ice. The Southern is the last boat of the winter service to St. John. She is consigned to J. T. Knight and Co.

100 ton 22 year old schooner St. Louis

from Halifax for Malpeque, with gen-

eral merchandise, was wrecked off

Albion, C.B. Capt. Landry and crew

saved. The vessel struck a rock and

sank. The cargo floated ashore. The

schooner was valued at \$2,000; cargo,

\$5,000. Both were fully insured.
