## CONDITIONS FAVORABLE FOR BULLS ON WALL STREET EXCHANGE YESTERDAY

Market had brief period of speculation hysteria—Trading of first half hour without parallel in history of Wall Street.

New York, April 16.—Apart from a fresh ebullition of speculation hysteria which was most conspicuous in various industrial and equipment issues, today's active stock market was essentially two-sided. That is, the buying of specialties frequently was offset by heavy selling of standard shares, which yielded much of their early advantage, though closing with general net gains.

What extent of "pools" and "syndicates" figure in the day's operations must remain a matter of debate or individual opinion. Representative issues were under moderate pressure throughout the session, even though some, particularly United States Steel, attained their highest prices of the movement. Union Pacific, Reading and a few others which are commonly regarded as market barometers, fell to lowest levels in the final hour, though recovering, in part, towards the end, which was marked by a confusion of prices.
