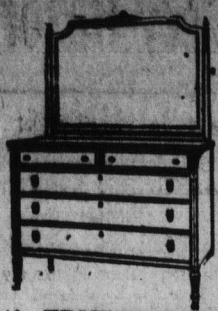

FOUR TRAIN WRECKS IN THE PAST TWO DAYS

Much Damage Caused Thursday and Friday—C. G. R., the C. P. R. and S. and A. Roads Suffer—Main Lines Were Blocked.

The C.G.R., the C.P.R. and S. and A. have been having serious trouble on the lines during the past two days, trains have been wrecked, traffic held up, much damage done and the cost for the same amounts a great amount of money.

On Thursday morning a side rail broke on the locomotive of the C.G.R. Sussex train, near Sussex, and accordingly the train was delayed for four hours. On the same day an engine and nine cars of a C.G.R. west bound freight left the rails between Little Port and Athol near Springhill Junction. About two hundred yards of track was torn up and the line blocked for hours.

On Thursday a defective rail was the cause of two locomotives leaving the track of the Salisbury and Albert railroad and both engines toppled over on their sides. One locomotive became stalled with the ice and snow on the track and a second engine was sent to assist it after the two locomotives reached a point near Hillsboro station the accident happened.

At four o'clock yesterday morning the main line of the C.G.R. between St. John and Medford was tied up by the derailment of twelve loaded freight cars on an east bound train at Nerepis, 17 miles from St. John. The train was made up of thirty cars and it is presumed that the accident was caused by a broken rail. As a result passengers on east and west bound trains had to be transferred.

A number of the cars that left the rails, were overturned, and as the train was traveling at about twenty miles an hour at the time of the accident the roadbed was badly torn up. Five of the cars were derailed in a cut which makes it all the more difficult to clear away the wreckage. Auxiliary trains were immediately sent out from Bay Shore and Medford. The main line was all clear last night.

The Halifax express locomotive on the C.P.R., which left the city at seven o'clock yesterday morning, left the rails at No. 2 switch between Gilbert Lane and the Island yard. The engine did not upset but the tender which was heavily loaded with coal and water did and the contents of the same were strewn all round while the trucks were thrown a distance of about ten feet away. The baggage car was also derailed and the forward end of the car was badly damaged. The passengers and the cars that did not leave the rails were returned to the depot and another train was made up leaving eastward about 10.45 o'clock. A gang of men were set to work and it was not long before the line was cleared again.

DOES BETTER THAN NEW BRUNSWICK

Ontario Gets \$3,000,000 Loan at Net Cost of 6.3166 Per Cent.

Toronto, Feb. 21.—Hon. T. W. McGarry made his promised statement in the legislature regarding the new provincial loan. The province, he announced, would get \$3,000,000, at a net cost of 6.3166 per cent. It was with a great deal of pride he said, that he announced that the province was able to make a loan on these terms. It was the best loan placed by any government, other than that of the Dominion, in the last twelve months. The loan will be placed by Wood Gundy and Company with large investors, in such a manner as not to interfere with the prospects of the next Dominion loan.
