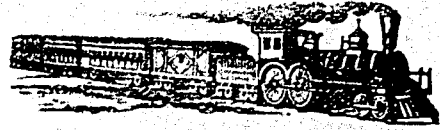

NOTICE TO CONTRACTORS.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the Secretary of
Public Works, and endorsed "Tender for Canal and
Lock at St. Anne," will be received at this office until
the arrival of the Eastern and Western mails on
FRIDAY, the 10th DAY OF OCTOBER next, for the
construction of a Lock and the formation of approaches
to it on the landward side of the present lock at St.
Anne.

A map of the locality, together with plans and speci-
fication of the works to be done, can be seen at this
office and at the Resident Engineer's office at St. Anne,
on and after SATURDAY, the 27th DAY OF SEP-
TEMBER next, at either of which places printed
forms of Tender can be obtained.

Contractors are requested to bear in mind that tenders
will not be considered unless made strictly in accordance
with the printed forms, and—in the case of firms, except
where there are attached the actual signatures, the nature of
the occupation and residence of each member of the
firm; and further, an accepted Bank cheque for the
sum of \$2,000 must accompany the Tender, which sum
shall be forfeited if the party tendering declines enter-
ing into contract for the works, at the rates and on the terms
stated in the offer submitted.

The cheque thus sent in will be returned to the re-
spective parties whose tenders are not accepted.
For the due fulfilment of the contract, satisfactory
security will be required by the deposit of money to the
amount of five per cent. on the bulk sum of the contract;
of which the sum sent in with the Tender will be con-
sidered a part.

Ninety per cent. only of the progress estimates will be
paid until the completion of the work.
To each Tender must be attached the actual signatures
of two responsible and solvent persons, residents of the
Dominion, willing to become sureties for the carrying out
of these conditions, as well as the due performance of
the works embraced in the Contract.

This Department does not, however, bind itself to ac-
cept the lowest or any tender.

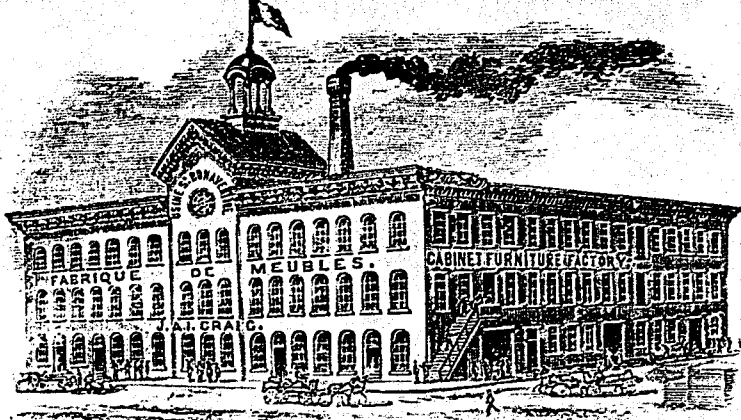

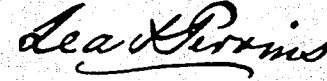
