And it is hereby also further enacted by the Authority aforesaid, That out of all or any the Aids or Supplies provided as aforesaid, there shall and may be issued and applied any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Two hundred thousand pounds, upon Account, to enable His Majesty to give a proper Compensation to the respective Provinces in North America, for the Expences incurred by them in the Levying, Cloathing, and Pay, of the Troops raised by the same, according as the active Vigour and strenuous Efforts of the respective Provinces shall be thought by His Majesty to merit; and any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Twenty thousand pounds, upon Account, to be paid to the United Company of Merchants of England trading to the East Indies, to- wards enabling them to defray the Expence of a Military Force in their Settlements to be maintained by them, in lieu of the Battalion of His Majesty's Forces commanded by Colonel Adlercron withdrawn from thence, and now returned to Ireland; and any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding fifteen thousand pounds, to be paid into the Chamber of the City of London, to be applied to- wards the improving, widening, and enlarging, the Pas- sage over and through London Bridge, without Account, other than as is directed for the Monies raised by an Act made in the Twenty ninth Year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, An Act to improve, widen, and enlarge, the Passage over and through London Bridge; and any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding forty four thousand one hundred ninety seven pounds, and ten Shillings, upon Account, towards enabling the Governors and Guardians of the Hospital for the Maintenance and Education of ex- posed and deserted young Children, to maintain and edu- cate such Children as were received into the said Hospital on or before the Twenty fifth Day of March, One thou- sand seven hundred and sixty, from the Thirti first Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and sixty, exclu- sive, to the Thirti first Day of December, One thousand seven hundred and sixty one, inclusive; and that the said Sum be issued and paid for the Use of the said Hospital without Fee or Reward, or any Deduction whatsoever; and any Sum or Sums of Money not exceeding Thirteen thousand pounds, to be employed in maintaining and sup- porting the Fort at Anamaboe, and the other British Forts and Settlements upon the Coast of Africa; and any Sum
