In the time of the Fathers the repugnance toward wealth, the moral condemnation of wealth as a matter of fact it then commonly presented itself as a result of violence & fraud & associated with luxury, the suspicious attitude towards wealth associated with the teaching of brotherly love among Christians who seemed to evolution concurrent of enjoyment of wealth of persons, these various influences caused some of them to use very strong language re the "unnaturalness" of private property & naturalness of community. - In 1881 Ambrose "Nature has put all things in common for common right etc" - violence made private right!

Again as early as 1870s when the 2nd Amendment of our Constitution which early & clearly expected seemed further postponed, as more serious & statesmanlike of theologians recognizing existing social order, there was felt the same necessity as in case of slavery etc such a defense etc. and satisfying the Christian conscience & recognizing social order. - So quite early one finds some fathers expiating remuneration of riches = revenue of lone brothers - & that wealth obtained & used for good of the brethren who normally included all subjects.

The complete theory of the subject was formulated in case of property as in case of slavery by St. Augustine. In his mind there was almost a complete parallel. True in state of nature no property, as no slaves, all men equal, but fall of man had needed civil law & human law: property protected during continuance of present civil world, but otherwise,

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
