Referring to your letter of the 15th October and my reply thereto in connection with the desire of Mr. J.J. Garland of Portage la Prairie to dispose of his farm to the Board, I beg to advise that we now have received a report from the District Superintendent at Winnipeg. From this report it appears that the original option price in the case of Liddle was \$4500. and in the case of Winch \$5500., and the district office thought these figures too high. As a result of considerable negotiation, however, they have now been able to secure the vendor's acceptance at \$3300. and \$4300. respectfully.

I have no doubt that the loans will now proceed in the usual course.
