
I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 7th instant, reporting in regard to the closing of the Regina Industrial School; and in reply I beg to say that the Department is pleased to observe therefrom that matters have been satisfactorily adjusted.

With regard to the copy of cash book which accompanied your report, I beg to say that the Department desires an explanation in regard to payment to R.B. Heron of \$19.20 "petty cash" and also the payment to him of \$35.00, "pupils' cash."

I may say that the Department expects to receive from you receipts for all disbursements which you made in connection with the school.

A letter has been received by the Department from Mr E.E. Sutton of the Public Works Department, Regina, in regard to two cottages situated on the school farm, which buildings he desires to purchase. If you are of the opinion that these cottages are salable, and should be sold, you should make arrangements to have them disposed of by public auction, after the sale has been properly advertised. The Department desires that you will communicate with Mr Sutton and inform him of the Department's instructions to you in this matter. In the event of a sale taking place, the Department will, of course, require a full report from you in the matter.
