Dear Mr. Nicholson -

With reference to the purchase of the Austin property at Chapleau, I observe that the amount of land is less by at least about 30 acres than had been originally understood. As this reduction comprises not less than one-fifth of the original area, it is a question as to whether the amount of \$1,000.00 to be paid for this land should not be correspondingly reduced to \$800.00.

I am anxious that the question of title to this property be cleared up with as little delay as possible.

I have today written to Messrs. McKessock and Miller in connection with the matter.
