- Q. And carry on?
- When I came home I knew the wife had been writing letters to someone and I found a letter from a man in Petawawa, something to do with her because, she had been frinking, I asked her about it and she told me I was a sucker, it was not my fault but I was in the army and she was still drawing dependents' allowance.
 - Q. Did you return to Chatham?
 - No, I was put out, I told her I did not feel like soldiering to keep someone else's child and keep someone who called me a sucker.
 - What happened after that?
 - A. I left home, I said I was not going to the her. I went north and got a job.
 - You worked after? Q.
 - Yes up north.
 - You continued to work there?
 - Until, I think, around the 1st of February.
 - This year?
 - Yes, Bir.
 - Q. What then?
 - Well I wrote mother and told her where I was and told her I thought I would come to Toronto and make arrangements to go back to the army. I came back to Toronto and sent the uniform to mother's to get it pressed and cleaned but in the meantime I was apprehended by the Provost Corps.
