

- Q. Did you know him in Headley?
A. Yes.
- Q. Had you known him very long?
A. Quite some time - a matter of months.
- Q. Did you see him on 9th May?
A. Yes, at approximately 1800 hrs
- Q. Where were you at that time?
A. Standing beside Living Hut 3.
- Q. And where was he?
A. On the top of Cell Block 4.
- Q. What is at the top of cell 4?
A. There is a watch tower on the top.
- Q. Can you tell us about it?
A. The watch tower stands approx 40 feet above the roof. It is approximately 6 or 7 feet square at the top. Approx 12 to 14 feet square at the bottom. It has a little building with a cat walk around the outside.
- Q. Whereabouts is that building?
A. The building part is on the top. I was standing at the end of Living Hut 3 nearest to Living Hut 2.
- Q. Where was the accused?
A. On the roof of Cell Block 4.
- Q. What was he doing?
A. He and another SUS were placing inflammable material on the legs of the hut.
- Q. Who was the other SUS?
A. Gravel.
- Q. What was this inflammable material?
A. Straw from the palliasses, dry boards, palliasses, board from the beds.
- Q. Do you know where the bed boards came from?
A. Handed up from the adjoining cell block.
- Q. Handed up by whom?
A. Other SUS.
- Q. Were there other SUS around?
A. Yes, on the ground. I would say approximately 25.
- Q. In the base of the watch tower open or closed?
A. Open, Sir.
- Q. Would you tell the Court what you saw being done?
A. The inflammable material was placed between the legs, the fire was lit and then I saw the SUS climbing the side facing the parade square and they attached some blankets to the side so that the flames could crawl up these.
- Q. Did you see who it was who laid the fire?
A. No, Sir.
- Q. Did you see flames?
A. Yes, Sir, the flames were in progress when the accused climbed up.
- Q. When you first saw the accused was it before or after you saw flames?
A. Before
