- A.186 No Sir.
- Q.187 You may not have then, but do you know the names of any of them, now?
- A.187 No Sir.
- Q.188 Is there anybody in this room that came into that Mess during the evening?
- A.188 Yes.
- Q.189 Who?
- A.189 Mr. Corbett and the Officer sitting next to him
(Indicates Mr. Corbett and his escort Mr. Christie)
