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morning. I went into camp through the back way. I looked around to see if there was anybody around and there wasn't.

I went into one of the officers tents. I just cracked open one box. I filled up one of the cases thus with a .45 automatic from one of the boxes. I think it belonged to the Cavalry, some civilian clothing, boxes of cigarettes, a Rolls royce which I found in a truck, a camera and other stuff. I got disturbed when one of the fellows came along and I made a run for it, leaving my cap behind. I also left my own revolver, a .38, in the case I was packing. I intended taking the stuff to London to sell it. The only main reason why I did it is because I want to get back to Canada.
