SIR,—I have the honour to submit for your approval a revision of Entomological Circular No. 4 entitled: "Instructions to Importers of Trees, Plants and other Nursery Stock into Canada." This revision has been necessitated by the recent repeal by Order in Council on the 4th of November of the former Regulations and the substitution of new Regulations arranged in three sections: General Regulations, Plant Disease Regulations, and Insects and Fests Regulations. The first and last only are detailed in this circular. No material change was made in the regulations governing the importation of nursery stock and the fumigation and inspection of such plants.

This circular has been prepared by me for the guidance of persons importing nursery stock of various classes into Canada. Accordingly, a brief explanation of the requirements precedes the Regulations under The Destructive Insect and Pest Act, all of which are duly set forth.
