VANCOUVER, B.C. — McLennan, McFeeley & Company are having plans prepared for a large wholesale warehouse to be built on the north-west corner of Cordova street east and Columbia ave.—Hooper & Watkins, architects, have just taken tenders on a stone and brick building to be erected on corner of Pender and Hamilton streets for the Oddfellows Lodge No. 10.—The Home Telephone Company, represented by W. J. Arment, of Portland, will make application to the City Council for a franchise for a telephone system.—Edward Cook will add two stories to his block on Water street, between Cambie and Abbott streets.—Competitive plans will probably be called for by the City Council for the improvement of the tide flats at the head of False Creek.—A. 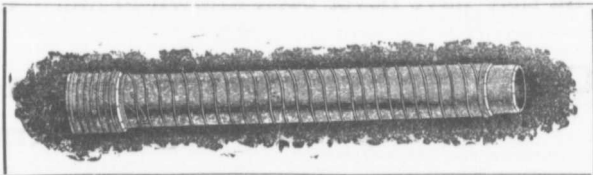
