The Hebrew Relief and Aid Society, of New York, has taken steps looking to the colonization in one or more Western States of the Russian Jewish refugees, and to this end have commissioned the Secretary of the organization, Mr. Julius Goldman, to visit the West and examine into the methods and operations of the different colonization societies. Mr. Gold-man called on the Secretary of the Irish Catholic Colonization Association, in Chicago, and obtained from Mr. Onahan full and interesting data respecting the colonies in Nebraska, Minnesota and Arkansas. sota colonies. In a report which appears in a late number of the Milwaukee Sentinel, Mr. Goldman says: "The Irish Colonies are a great success. Not only are they managed in a superior manner, but the people live together very harmoniously. "In the Russian and Mennonite Colon-

ies the very reverse is the case. In these latter Colonies, too, the people appeared to be very shiftless compared with those in the Irish Colonies.
