She remained thirty hours repairing, taking on board 1996 Federal soldiers, and 35 officers, lately re-leased from the Cahawba and Andersoaville prisons.—She arrived at Memphis last evening and after coaling proceeded. About 2 p. m., when seven miles up she blew up and immediately took fire and burned to the water's edge. Of 2106 souls on board, not more than 700 will be recovered ; 500 wire rescued, and are now in the hospital ; 200 or 300 unin-jured are at the Soldiers' Home. Capt. Mason of the Sultana is supposed to be lost. At 4 o'clock this morning the river in front of Memphis was covered with soldiers struggling for life, many of them badly scalded. 
