The question being put thereon, a division ensued, and the same being carried in the affirmative by a Majority of eleven,

Ordered, that said petition be returned to Mr. *De Rocheblave*.

And the same was returned accordingly.

Upon motion of Mr. *Richardson*, seconded by Mr. *Lees*, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House upon the Bill, for the appointment of Inspectors to ascertain the quality of Pot and Peal Ashes for exportation.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. *McNider*, took the Chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair,

And Mr. *McNider* reported, that the Committee had made further progress and beg leave to sit again.

Ordered, that the same Committee have leave to sit again.

Then on motion of Mr. *P. L. Panel*, seconded by Mr. *McNider*,

The House adjourned till Monday next, at three o'clock in the afternoon.
