Old Crown Duties levied in the Colonies under the Acts 4 Geo. 3d, cap. 15, 6 Geo. 3d, cap. 52, and 14 Geo. 3d, cap. 88, were applicable to meet charges of this nature, but the said Duties have now been repealed by the Act of 5 and 6 Vict. cap. 49, hereinbefore referred to.
