Welland, Ont., June 15.—It has been shown that former Secretary of State Bryan is friendly towards the Germans, says The Telegraph, by an incident which has not before been related in the public press. Some three months ago there was received at Welland a cheque for \$500 from Mr. Bryan for the alleviation of distress among interned Germans in this county. It was a personal gift from the United States Secretary of State, and it was intended that no one should know anything about it. It was found, however, that he had not a solitary German interned in this county, so negotiations were entered into with a view of having the money diverted for the use of Austrians and Hungarians. The Telegraph has not learned that such diversion was made, but thinks that the money was returned to Mr. Bryan. 127

POPULACE

Brussels has heard of Warneford's (the Canadian aviator) destruction of another Zeppelin, which, according to the Brussels account, was sent by the invaders of June 7. There was a report of still another Zeppelin being destroyed, but this report has not yet been confirmed. 127

This village is just six miles from Folkstone, the famous English summer resort on the channel. I am sending you a post card of the place. The cliffs of France can be seen quite plainly from the promenade. We have passes every night from 4.30 to 12 midnight, so Folkstone will see us quite frequently. We were down last night and we are going again to-night. It is just fifteen minutes on the train from here, and there is a train every few minutes. Motor omnibuses also run down for 6 pence. Oh, hang that confounded English money! I've had more arguments over it than anything else for a year. We are in fine new bunk houses with plenty of blankets and a mattress. Well, for the present, this is enough, I think. So, so-long. J. F. L. Simmons, No 83032, Headquarters Staff, Fourth Brigade, Second Canadian Expeditionary Force, Army Post Office, London. GAS, PART OF WAR PLANNING

London, June 15.—The Morning Post says this morning: "A letter, received in Loanhead, Midlothian, by friends of a corporal serving in the Canadian contingent, state that his company, on capturing one of the enemy's trenches, found eight reservoirs of poisonous gas marked 1914, and also respirators dated 1917. Casey, who is to be congratulated on the ability with which he handles his bunch of "rookies." A few presented themselves for enlistment, including Rudolph Sasse, James Kildy, Elgin Murtagh, who, by the way, has 20 years' service in the U. S. Infantry to his credit, as well as the qualifications of a wireless operator. The foregoing were, however, not accepted, and only one man, Percy Calvesbert, of Winnett street, was able to obtain permission to "obtain" his rank and don the prescribed uniform. Numerous incidents crop up in a night at the armories that not only impress, but are to a certain degree pathetic. Two little fellows, one from "Londing" and the other from "Glesca," made their debut, but alas! the standard height had three inches too many for them, and with disappointed commingling of Doric and Whitechapel patois they went off. It is not expected that the men will leave for a week yet, and no arrangements to that end have been made so far.
