### The Road Improvements Contemplated

Each year sees our roads coming better throughout this district, and a number of changes and improvements are planned for this season. The large graders, now working in the Magrath country, will gradually come this way, as all graded roads will be worked and crowned this year, weather permitting.

Further extensions for grading will be made in the Beaver, Boundary Creek and Del Bonita districts and the Glenwood road is to be completed. This last is a very good road as far as the work has been done, being a higher grade than is customary, and was constructed in this manner at an additional cost by the request of the Good Roads Association, under promise of defraying the increased cost. However we understand as yet this Association has not made good its promise.

Bridge improvements upon the Milk River and the Belly River are also contemplated. The people of Lenz and Del Bonita will doubtless be pleased to know that the bridge on their road will be moved up the Milk River stream, where the approaches cannot wash out and that a good grade up the hill on the east side will be made so as to give a permanent winter road and avoid the tortuous route following the coulee that is now travelled.

The new route to Mt. View now opened is one of the best winter roads in the foothill country, following very closely the first pioneer wagon trail made in 1887. This will be a popular road too, when the bridge across the Belly River is put in and the work will begin this season. A great saving in distance will thus be made between Cardston and the Waterton Park, as the new road proceeds west almost directly to the river from Mt. View, and then on toward the Park. The long detour north to the present bridge will thus be avoided.

A force of men will soon be at work under the resident foreman here, Mr. Adam Hendry, in dragging all the grades in the district, which will be a much appreciated performance.

Great credit is due our local member of the Provincial Parliament, Mr. Martin Woolf, who has always been alive to our needs and has been able to get the necessary appropriations to go on with these improvements. Before the large audience present at the Stake Tabernacle on April 30th., he gave a very interesting account of the legislative work of the last session which we would very much like to give in greater detail had we the space. As citizens, irrespective of our politics, we should certainly feel grateful to and also proud of our representative. As deputy-speaker, few if any members, work harder or command greater respect. Let us not wait too long in showing our appreciation of such faithful service.

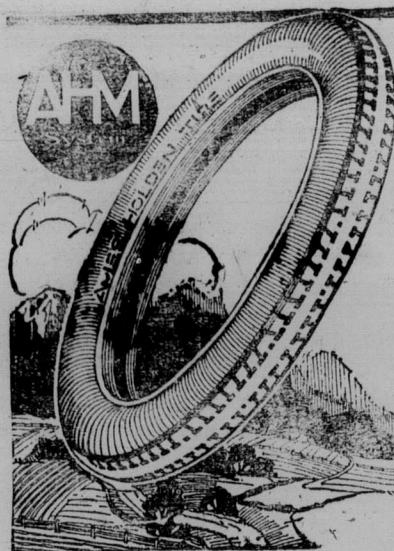

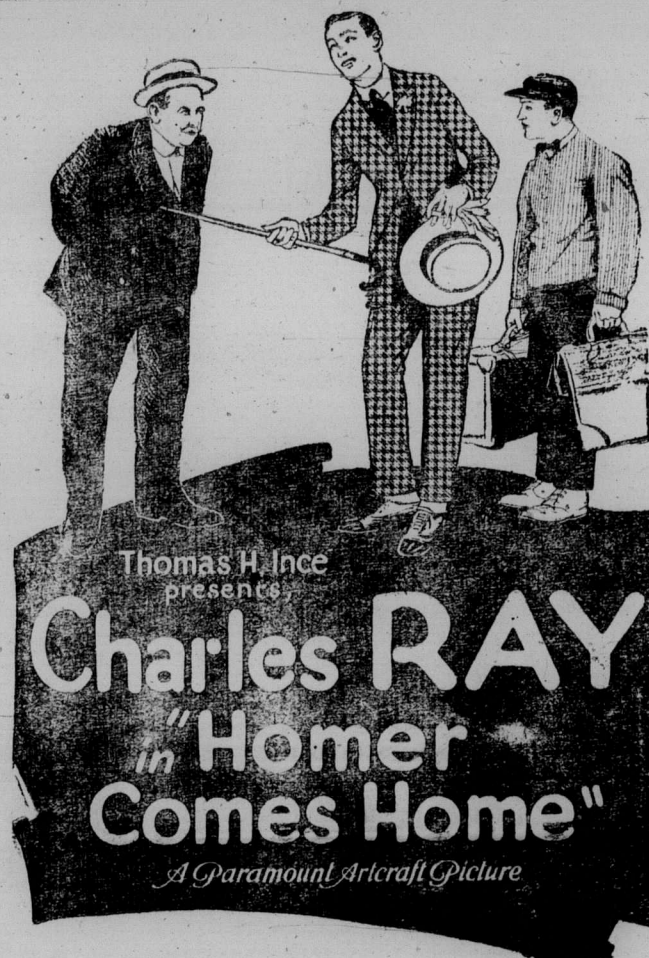
### New Golf Course
