## CHILDREN PERISH IN GRAND FALLS FIRE

House and Store of Samuel Simkevitz Destroyed in Early Morning Fire Discovered by Mother When Awakened by Cat's Mewing

Two small children burned to death and two others were with great difficulty saved from a similar fate when the building in which they lived was totally destroyed by fire at Grand Falls early Sunday morning. The children who were the victims were Irving, aged three years, and Harold, aged four months.

It was through the efforts of the mother that the other two children were rescued. She rushed into the house, after having given the alarm, and fought her way through the flames to her children. She managed to carry the two older ones to safety. She tried to reach the younger boys, but was driven back by the flames and smoke, and had to abandon the attempt.

The fire broke out in the morning and completely destroyed the meat and grocery store and dwelling owned and occupied by Samuel Simkevitz. The dwelling was over his store.

The parents of the children retired after midnight and about 2 o'clock Mrs. Simkevitz was awakened by the loud and peculiar mewing of the cat. She found the store and front of the house all in flames. Rousing her hus-

band, she ran out in the bitterly cold night in her night clothes and bare feet to raise the alarm. When she got back to the house she heard the two older children calling her. The lights had gone out but she groped her way to them and got them out. She then tried to reach the younger children in an adjoining room, but it was impossible.

Mrs. Simkevitz had rushed down stairs but hurried back to assist her family. He could hear his little son crying and calling for help and made frantic efforts to reach him, but the smoke and flames were so dense that he could not. In the confusion and darkness, he was badly burned and bruised and it was almost a miracle that he got out alive.

The bodies of the two children were found before noon today. Nothing was saved from the store or house. The loss was very great, including a goodly sum of money.

Mr. Simkevitz has been for several years one of the leading merchants here and both he and Mrs. Simkevitz have the heartfelt sympathy of the community in their terrible bereavement.

## LUMBER CUT IS STILL INCREASING

Hauling has started in some sections—Huge Operations—Fraser Special on C. N. E.

Hauling in many logging sections of New Brunswick has started. Outfitting of logs is still being carried on in many sections. By the end of the month, the logging season will be in full swing.

The snow which has been heavy in the southern part of New Brunswick has been light in the north. That has been favorable to operations and the latter have been much larger than anticipated.

From time to time as the logging season has advanced estimates of the cut on Crown Lands have been revised. Each revision was an increase and until February 1, it will be impossible to make an estimate which should approximate the total as operators are in almost all cases cutting more than they intended at the first of the season.

The estimate for the Crown Land cut is now about 200 million feet. Resolute County has about seventy million feet of that quantity. Operations on a large scale are going on there. Other counties also are large as far as cut is concerned. The extent of operations may be judged from the fact that the number of men engaged in operations on Crown Lands alone approximates the present population of Fredericton—about nine thousand.

In addition to the Crown Land operations are large operations on the lands of the New Brunswick railway company which lie in York, Carleton, Victoria, and Madawaska counties. The cut on private lands throughout the province is expected to equal that on Crown Lands making a large total. There are numerous operations with hundreds of men employed in the woods. Fraser Companies, limited, lumber woods employ all told in thousands. On the Transcontinental section of the C. N. E., a special train is run for the accommodation of those employed by that company and in connection with its operations which is known as the Fraser Special.

## GRAND FALLS POWER COMPANY

Fraser Special on C. N. E.

The part of the province of New Brunswick toward development of Grand Falls hydro power, which was first announced in the press in December and which had official recognition last week at the meeting of the provincial government when the New Brunswick Power Commission presented a report has aroused the international Paper Company to some action in connection with the rights which the company has at Grand Falls, an extension of which to April 1 was made two years ago. The International Paper Company has inaugurated an advertising campaign which will cover the press of the province and similar to that which it conducted last year. The advertisements are for the purpose of ascertaining how much electric current can be taken in the province. All possible Grand Falls development, municipalities, corporations and private consumers are asked to inform the company what quantity they could take. Advertisements of the same tenor appeared in the press about two weeks before the last extension was granted.

## PASSING OF J. B. SHAW

John B. Shaw died at his Auburn, Maine, home on Wednesday, Jan. 3, 1924. He had been an invalid for two years by paralysis and his sudden passing was due to a second shock sustained on the above date. The subject of this sketch was born in Hartland, February 26, 1862, the son of Richard K. and Hannah Gallop Shaw. His childhood and early manhood was spent on a farm at Woodville where he married a neighbor's daughter, Miss Amelia Shaw. Later the family moved to Mattawamkeag and about thirty years ago began securing lucrative employment with one firm after another to that city and here at 30 Eastern Avenue, he made his home and worked and prospered. He raised and educated his family of three boys and three girls all of whom with his widow survive him.

Mr. Shaw was a gentleman, an ideal family man and a Christian, being for years a devoted member of the Court street Baptist church. The funeral was held from his home, Saturday, Jan. 6, at 2 p. m., interment being made in Mount Auburn.

Other relatives of deceased are sister, Mrs. Alexander McLaughlin, Boston, Mass.; two brothers, Frank A. of Hartford, Mass. and Leon A. of Portland, N. H.; Mrs. S. H. Shaw and Miss Helen Shaw of Woodville, Victoria are cousins. Mr. Shaw has frequently visited in Carleton county and there are many here who will mourn his death with deep regret.

## IMPORTANT TOPIC IN COUNTY COUNCIL

Hartland Representatives Show Peculiar And Unjust Discrepancy in Tax Adjustment Whereby Woodstock Profits at Expense of This Town

On Wednesday a delegation representing the Hartland Town Council appeared before the County Council now in session at Woodstock and urged certain reforms in the assessment of the county.

The following resolutions were presented by the delegation for the consideration of the council: Whereas the Budget assessed upon the County for the year 1923 amounted to \$383,500; And Whereas \$11,200 of such budget so assessed as aforesaid amounting to nearly 10 per cent thereof, consisted of arrears of taxes for the year 1921 charged against various parishes for that year, in addition to the sum of \$1500 for interest on overdraft largely due to such arrears;

And Whereas by including such arrears in such budget for the year 1923 the said back taxes were distributed among and paid by the ratepayers of all the parishes of the County including the parish of Hartland which has paid the 1921 assessment in full;

And Whereas such arrangement is inequitable and unjust to such parishes as so paying in full, if not contrary to the letter or spirit of the law;

Be It Therefore Resolved that in making up the County assessment for the year 1923, no such arrears or any part thereof be included in the general budget assessed upon the County, but that such arrears be charged back to the respective parishes in which the same were incurred and that each parish will liquidate its own arrears of the spirit of these resolutions:

1. That the present system of assessing the county taxes, whereby if a parish is in arrears for a certain year, these arrears are added to the general budget and the most poor and needy parishes are made to pay the taxes of the parish which are in arrears as well as to pay a share of the delinquent taxes in the parishes which are behind;

2. That the present system is so inequitable to the parishes which may be behind at present as in a few years they will have to pay the taxes of the county and be forced to help pay the arrears of other parishes;

3. The present system practically places a premium upon delinquency, as there is no special motive for a parish collector to endeavor to collect the taxes of the parish which are behind;
