The council resumed at 10 a.m.

Coun. Melville from the special committee on the question of passing a bye-law bringing into force the law relating to taxing dogs made verbal report. Couns. Hagerman and Estey also reported.

It was moved by Coun. Estey, seconded by Coun. Carvell, that the petition of 25 householders of Richmond asking to have a law put in force to tax dogs, be accepted, and the Secty-Treas. be instructed to prepare the necessary bye-law and submit same to Council for passing at tomorrow's session—carried.

On motion a committee of four was appointed to meet Mr. Peacock and take up the matter of technical education. Couns. Estey, Gibson, Shaw and Melville were appointed.

**THE VOCATIONAL EDUCATION ACT.**

(The Need)

Outside of Woodstock there are 600 boys and girls in Carleton County of high school age not in school. Many who are past school age would be glad to take short courses in subjects connected with their daily occupation. Agriculture is one of the greatest of the sciences and is the basic industry of the nation, it has wonderful possibilities. Present school courses not preparing the majority for life. The County Vocational School used in many places in West and in States.

There is a Vocational School Building now in Woodstock. Can it be made to serve the county?

(The Law.)

Defines Vocational Education being training that fits for profitable employment.

Provides for County Boards of seven, four of whom are named by the Council.

Will the Council name this committee to look into the question?

Will the Council pass a resolution favoring Dominion aid for Vocational Education?
