The Rordon Pulp and Paper Co. is making plans for forest planting on cut-over portions of its timber limits in the province of Quebec. During 1917, about 400,000 seedlings of forest species will be planted. A forest nursery is also to be developed, the capacity of which will be 1,000,000 small trees each year for planting on the holdings of the company. A. C. Volkmar is the forester in charge of this work, with headquarters at St. John's, P. Q. In addition to the nursery and planting work, information is being collected systematically with regard to the amount of growth which is taking place on the Company's property. It is obvious that this information is very important in connection with the preparation of plans for the permanent handling of a large area of forest land, on the basis of perpetual operation. The investment involved in the erection of a pulp and paper mill is so great that a company of this kind must look far into the future, in figuring on its sources of timber supplies.

The Laurentide Co. and the Pejeapoot Paper Co. have already made considerable progress in forest planting on their lands in Quebec, with a view to the future production of timber for the manufacture of pulp and paper. The Laurentide Co. is the pioneer in this direction, its forestry work having for years been managed by E. Wood Wilson. The forestry and planting work for the Pejeapoot are being directed by J. E. Rothary.

**SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-
WEST LAND REGULATIONS**

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age may, instead of a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchasing homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$300.
