Under the new tariff bill, which it is expected will become law on the first of October, the duty on barley will be increased from Ioc. to 30c. per bushel; eggs, now admitted free, will be taxed 5c. per dozen; there will be a specific duty of \$30 per head on horses and an ad valorem duty in addition of 30 per cent. on all valued at over \$150, ad the duty on hay will be increased from

Alsoming our export of barley to the United States to be the same this year as last, the increase in the tax would be from \$1,000,000 to \$3,000,000.
